Land as commodity: market-based approach Land as a human right: human rights-based approach


Pro-poor or antipoor land policy?

KEY LAND CHALLENGES IN THE AP REGION

- Access to land/tenure insecurity
- Women's tenure security and access to land and resources
- Incomplete or outdated legal and regulatory frameworks
- Outdated technology that makes land demarcation, regularization and titling a lengthy and expensive process
- Dispersion and overlap of responsibilities across different institutions;
- Rapid urbanization and urban growth
- The impact of climate change and natural disasters on tenure security
- Islamic tenure and principles













SITUATION IN THE PHILIPPINES

- Advocacy and awareness raising to influence change






































Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction

Opportunities: Philippines 20-year Land Sector Development Framework 2010-2030)

Vision – a world-class efficient land administration and management system geared towards sustainable and equitable socio-economic growth of the Filipino people

Mission – The mission of the sector is to:

- Provide tenure security by accelerating formal recognition of all rights and providing effective and efficient LAM services
- Provide effective management of public and government owned land for the benefit of present and future Filipinos and promote optimal use and sustainable management of land and natural resources
- Establish an effective and transparent property valuation and taxation system to stimulate the real property market and maximize property revenue; and
- Develop an integrated Land Information System harnessing modern ICT in support of LAM functions and e-government services



Guiding principles: Equity, Efficiency, Accountability, Partnerships, Demand driven reform, Subsidiarity

Policy Themes/Strategic Policy Statements: Land Management, Land Administration, Land Information Management, Property Valuation and Taxation


